A Legacy for every Kiwi-pino



Filipinos are a people on the move. They've become at home in the world. In their search for relevant work and careers, a different lifestyle, better opportunity for their children or just plain wanderlust, they have reconfigured their new home with relationships — especially family ties, or family-like ties where there are none, rather than geography as the defining element of what a home and being at home means.

In his creative work as a prolific novelist, playwright and diarist relating to problems of human identity, individuality, responsibility, morality and po-

litical commitment, Max Frisch's comment decades ago on the unintended consequence of the guest worker policy in Europe "we called for workers and got human beings" — holds true today. Our experiences as a country of origin have taught us that when Filipinos migrate, the Philippines sends out human beings, with all their potentials and vulnerabilities.



International migration is more than the sum of

formidable structural forces and processes. In particular, the re-discovery of migrants' humanity has unravelled the human and social costs of migration on the one hand, and its possibilities for transformations on the other. Both sides are part of the promises and perils of migration. The risks are many yet the rewards for both the host country and migrant are, in almost all cases, mutually inclusive.

Despite their intention to bring in migrant workers, receiving countries like New Zealand have to reckon with human beings. Limiting migrants' rights has not kept migrants from expressing their humanity. Despite the conditions they often find themselves in at first, or perhaps because of such conditions, they seek out other migrants and like-minded individuals in their new homes, they begin building communities, and many eventually become permanent settlers melting into the new society they've embraced.

The Bulwagan Foundation is a registered charitable trust that, at its very core, believes in celebrating humanity. In expressing this more visibly, it is embarking on taking its plans for building a multi-purpose Community
